YOUTH FIGHT FOR JOBS!!

On Wednesday, June 25 and Friday June 27, 1975, several hundred youth of different nationalities jammed the L.A. City Council in quest for jobs. They came in with signs saying; "No more B.S. Give us our JOBS!" "Give us what we need-Jobs!"

With unemployment in the city over 11% and over 60% for youth, there is little wonder why this demonstration was organized.

At 10:00 AM on Wednesday they started their protest in the chamber. But it was 3 hours before the council got around to hearing their views. A lot of the youth were angered at the delay. One guy said, "You may have had important matters, but we should have been important too. After all we're the youth!" (quoted L.A. Times, June 26, 1975)

But those words, repeated year after year by youth and parents, fell on deaf ears. Speaker after speaker "impressed on the council the need for jobs now-not later in the summer or never!" (L.A. Times, June 26, 1975)

The council, with their fancy speeches, laid out that there was no federal funds, and had been used up in CETA funds. From Councilman Snyder to Lindsay the word was, no money!

But the anger in the youthful audience's faces soon got the council to concede a review of all jobs (15,800 for summer) and manpower training programs for youth. This was in case of unused or unnoticed funds. A report was to be made on Friday, at the next City Council meeting.

Still unsatisfied but determined to struggle, the youth returned on Friday.

This time the council came up with 719 new summer jobs. Of course this is just a drop in the bucket to what is really needed. The vast majority of the youth will not get to see those 719 jobs.

It was a crumb. It cannot make up for the thousands of youth who are without adequate jobs, social activities, sports, training, etc. It is not enough when all we get to look forward to is crime, dope, gangs and another hot summer in the streets.

The L.A. YOUNG COMMUNIST LEAGUE, fully supported the action taken on those two days in June. We respect the courage and determination that the brothers and sisters of all nationalities displayed. But that was just the beginning. We must fight for thousands of jobs. We have heard promised before, but we can't eat promises.

There's plenty of work to be done. We can fix up the schools, our neighborhoods, build new recreation and sports facilities, and be in skills training. And even the money is there. It is just not being spent on the benefit of the people in this country. The U.S. government has set up a 105 billion dollar military budget. We don't need that money for war. We are sick of war, of our finest sons and brother and fathers being killed or maimed for a handful of capitalists (Rockefeller, DuPont, Morgan and other owners of factories, banks and corporations), overseas.

In L.A. we need a city-wide L.A. Unemployed Council that can be the voice of the unemployed and the employed who support the fight for jobs. A beginning of such a council was that demonstrations on June 25 and 27. Another important step is a rally JULY 22, AT 10:00AM, confronting the LOS ANGELES BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. It will be held at the County Hall of Administration, 500 W. Temple in L.A. It is sponsored by the UNEMPLOYED COMMITTEE of the UNITED STEELWORKERS OF AMERICA, Local 1845.

FIGHTING FOR YOUR LIFE!!
(for the parents of Watts)

Is your child living in fear of his or her life? Recently there has been a lot of gang violence. A security guard was jumped trying to help a young man from getting beat up at a school.

At Markham Jr. High School in Watts, two young men and women were shot and killed by gang violence last year. They attempted to get away after hearing some shots. The school panicked and everyone ran for their lives. A girl tripped and fell and people stumbled over her!

Are you in fear when your child leaves the house to go to school? Would you like to help him? Think about it.

The whole United States of North America is on the brink of a depression. Unemployment is higher than ever. There is talk of another war where more youth will die! Schools are not educating and plans to phase out schools are being set-up!

Wouldn't you want your child working for a livable wage, rather than in jail, in the army or dead in the streets. The L.A. city can and must provide all of us, with jobs through federal funds. The government has a law, P.L. 93-203, that says all areas with 6.5% unemployment be given public service jobs. Where did these jobs go? Where did our tax money go? It went in the military budget, that's where. Somebody, somewhere is holding back! LET'S DEMAND THESE JOBS FROM THE MILITARY BUDGET, ESPECIALLY WHEN NOW TIMES ARE GETTING SO HARD!

We can set it up where neighbors help each other. We need help from church groups, community groups, Block clubs, Teen centers, and PTA's in this struggle. WILL YOU JOIN US in our fight for decent life? Think about it, please!

STOP POLICE KILLINGS

On Sunday, June 29, 1975, Randell Miles, along with Calvin Lewis and Roger Moore, were on their way to the Hollywood Bowl, where Earth, Wind and Fire were in concert.

On that day Randell Miles was killed by a police officer who shot him in the head. Policemen there claimed it was an accident but eyewitnesses and occupants of the car claimed the officer was two inches from Randell's windshield and shot Randell in cold blood.

Randell is dead! Like Freddie Shorts, Phillip Johns, Ricki Smith, Danny Garcia, Juan Juariqui, and Tony Wilkins among others who were killed by police in cold-blooded fashion. Tony Wilkins was also killed at the Hollywood Bowl not even a year before this year's incident. The facts show 40 related police killings of innocent Negroes last year (1974) and 35 so far this year. We are only half through this year without one police conviction. Those blood-thirsty police are still patrolling our streets.

When will this end? How many more of our brothers and sisters, particularly, Negro and Mexican national minority must die before justice is done?

The Peoples' Defense Committee was born with intentions of convicting officers

Paul Kailcoyne and Sgt. Jerrold Bender, with justice for Calvin Lewis and Roger Rockymore friends of Randell who were arrested on the scene. Also, for an end to any of these such incidents to ever occur again!

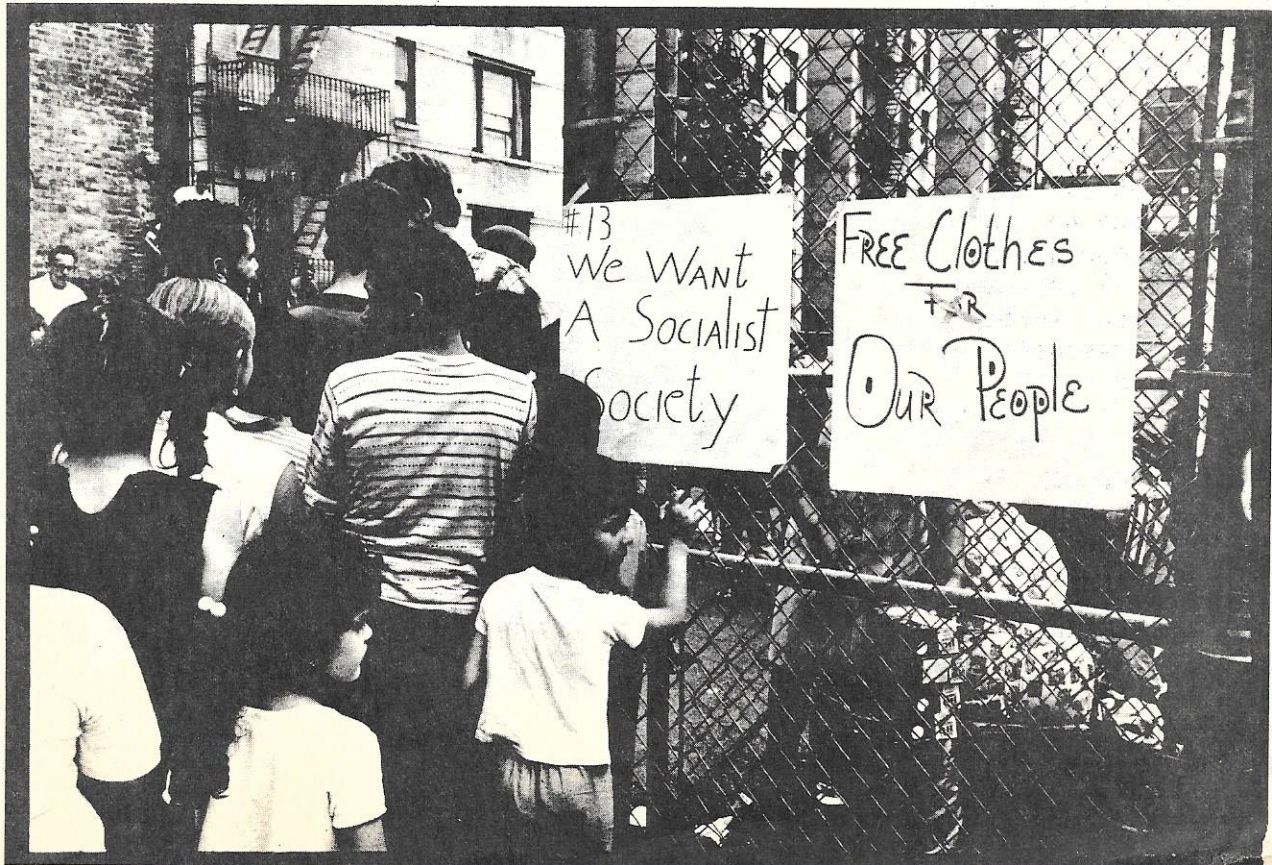
The police must answer to all their actions! No more attacks on our youth, our finest sons and daughters. No more blatant murder of the Negro people! No more legal lynchings of innocent workers! We have had enough!

The PDC is a defense league for all such attacks and as an ongoing committee to further this question beyond these attacks. We must--insure we can be safe, we must insure we live in a democratic society, not a fascist one.

JUVENTUD LUCHA POR EMPLEOS

El Miercoles 25 de Junio y el viernes, 27 de Junio de 1975, cientos de jovenes de diferentes nacionales, llenaron la camara de consilio de la ciudad de Los Angeles en demanda de empleos. Entraron con boletines que decian;

"Ya Basta de mentiras... Queremos nuestros empleos!"

"Denos lo que necesitamos-Empleos!"

El desempleo en la ciudad es 11% y mas del 60% entre la juventud. Con razon se explica por que la juventud no quiso esperar mas.

El miercoles a las 10:00am, comenzo la protesta en la camara. Pero fue despues de 3 horas que el consilio decidio prestarles atencion.

Muchos de los jovenes se enfadaron con la espera. Un muchacho dijo sobre eso, "Usted podra tener autos importantes pero nosotros tambien somos importantes. Despues de todo somos la juventud!" (Times de Los Angeles, de Junio 26, 1975)

Pero esas palabras repetidas ano tras ano por la juventud y los padres fueron escuchadas por oidos sordos. Orador tras orador "impresiono al consilio con la necesidad por empleos ahora-no despues de este verano o nunca!" (L.A. Times, Junio 26)

El consilio con sus frases de siempre dijo que no habian fondos federales, que habian sido usados para el programa CETA. Desde el consul Snyder hasta Lindsay, la respuesta era que no habia dinero!

Pero el enojo de la juventud hizo que el consilio consiediera unos empleos (15,800) para el verano, y programas de entrenamiento. Esto era en caso de fondos no fueron usados o que fueron inadvertidos. Un reporte debio ser hecho para el viernes siguiente en la junta del consilio de la ciudad. Todavia insatisfechos y dispuestos a

luchar los jovenes regresaron el viernes siguiente. Esta vez el consilio prometio 719 mas empleos este verano. Claro que esto es solamente una pequena parte de lo que se necesita. La mayoria de los jovenes no veran esos 719 empleos. Eran mijajas que esos jovenes tuvieron que aceptar.

Sin empleos adecuados, actividades sociales, deportes, entrenamientos, etc, los resultados suelen ser crimenes, pandillas, narcoticos y otro verano caliente en la calle. LA LIGA COMUNISTA JUVENIL DE LOS ANGELES apoya esta accion. Respetamos la valentia y determinacion que mostraron estos jovenes Negros, Mexicanos, Asiaticos, Anglos y otros. Pero eso solo fue el comienzo. Debemos luchar por miles de empleos. Claro que ay bastante empleos. Con estos trabajos podemos arreglar las escuelas, nuestras comunidades, crear facilidades deportivas y prepararlos para trabajos.

Y el dinero esta ahi, romas que no esta siendo usado para el beneficio de la gente en este paix. El gobierno de E.U.A. tiene 105 billiones de dolares para el presupuesto militar. No necesitamos ese dinero para la guerra., de que nuestros hermanos padres, y hijos sean matados, y mutilados por un punado de capitalistas (Rockefeller, DuPont, Morgan y demas duenos de fabricas, bancos y corporaciones), al otro lado de mar.

En Los Angeles necesitamos un consilio de desempleados que sea la voz de los desempleados y los empleados que apoyen la lucha. El comienzo por empesar ese consilio es un manifestacion que se llevara a cabo el 22 de Julio a las 10:00am para confrontar la camara de supervisores del condado de L.A., en la sala de ADMINISTRACION DEL CONDADO, 500 W. Temple en L.A., patrocinada por el comite de desempleados de Los Obreros de Metalurgica de America Local 1845. Unamonos, vayan a la manifestacion! EMPLEOS CON PAZ
