State Murderers Denounced. Local No. 355, I. W. W., and Local No. 121, W. F. of M., at Tonopah, Nevada, have jointly addressed the following to the governor and state legislature of Nevada:

"Whereas, we are a peace loving body and will stand for nothing but what is right and submit to nothing wrong, and in view of the fact that your honorable just and wise body are contemplating the act and enacting a law or statute providing for a state militia...
